Information for travellers into Germany – COVID-19 - Status 14th January 2021

(Please note that this information may change as the situation in Germany changes. The ISB is not liable for any of the information held therein)

Returning from RISK areas/countries

If you have returned from a RISK country/area listed in the [RKI list](#), the German government's CURRENT directive is that you automatically go into quarantine for 10 days.

- If you are returning from a *country where the new variant of the virus* has been found and/or the infection rate is very high you must test before you travel (not sooner than 48 hours beforehand) and can only enter Germany with proof of a negative test. This can be on paper or an electronic document and in German, English or in the French language.
- If you are returning from a “*general “ risk country*” you will need to test no later than 48 hours after your return

You may test again on day 6 and may be released from your quarantine if you test negative.

It is also mandatory to **digitally register your entry** into Germany with the authorities via this link: <http://www.einreiseanmeldung.de/> This obligatory registration is available in several different languages.

Testing in Bremen is available here:

Walk-in Corona Testing Center at MVZ Bremen Mitte which is open from **8am until 6pm** everyday.
Cost is 75€, payment via card only.
